
Meet Our Team Mell Schaer



Irene Holstein

1930 - 2019



We were privileged to hold Irene's Celebration of Life at the Barn on Saturday, March 23, 2019. Family and friends gathered to share stories and memories in a last goodbye to her.

She was surrounded by flowers, photos, and something very precious to her... the crib which she used for Debra Lee, the daughter she lost as an infant.

Irene was devoted to the Santee Historical Society and proudly served as our Sunshine Committee, sending out birthday, get well, and sympathy cards to all of our members. She also took her job of processing and mailing out our quarterly newsletters very seriously.

She is greatly missed!







Irene Mae Rahn Holstein

A 2016 interview with Irene by Tricia Luke

Irene was born 9 March 1930, the only child of Ruth & George W. Rahn of Ohio. When she was 13, the family moved to Pasco, WA where her Dad had a job in government. The war brought the Manhattan Project, the United States' development of the atomic bomb, to the nearby Hanford Site.



Unfortunately, Irene's Dad worked in a building where they were bringing in Plutonium and other radioactive materials to make the atomic bomb. Irene feels this is what caused her Dad's tuberculosis and his early death at age 42. Her Dad's illness caused them to "follow the sun" and the family moved from Pasco to San Francisco, and then Phoenix.



Irene finished school in Phoenix, and married Billy Dean Holstein at the age of 19.

They had a daughter, Debra Lee, and two sons, Stephen and Gary. Sadly, Debra died before she was a year old.

The Holstein family, including her mother Ruth, moved to Santee in the early 1960's when Billy Dean took the job of Safeway store manager. Irene remembered the Safeway was where the GTM store is now. That was the first shopping center in Santee and there were only two stoplights in Santee on Mission Gorge Road, one at Magnolia and one at Cuyamaca.





Irene, Billy Dean and the two boys lived in their house on Oakbourne Road. purchased brand new for \$17,500. Her boys loved living near so much open space and would take off on their bikes for hours. She never worried about them, though they later confessed they would sometimes ride to Parkway Plaza. In those days, Fletcher Parkway was a 2-lane road, and there was not as much traffic.

Carlton Hills Elementary was being built so her boys first went to school in houses... one still exists in the neighborhood.

Irene was a stay-at-home Mom until her boys were older. Her first job was with the School District. She later went to work for the Welfare Department in La Mesa. When she heard there was an opening in Edgemoor Hospital she jumped at the chance as it was close to home. She worked in medical records and made appointments for central nursing for 12 years before she retired.

Irene became a member of the Santee Historical Society while working at Edgemoor Hospital in the 1980's. When she retired in 1993, an RV trip thru all 48 states put her Santee Historical activities on hold. In 2010, she rejoined the society and took on the responsibilities of the Sunshine Committee.


