#### Goodbye Eloise -



CHANCE FOR A SPIN-STER. - A young man in Aroostook County, Maine, advertising for a wife, speaks of himself as follows: "I am eighteen years old, have a good set of teeth, and believe in Andy Johnson, the starspangled banner, and the 4th of July. I have taken up a State lot, cleared up eighteen acres last year, and seeded ten of it down. My buckwheat looks firstrate, and the oats and potatoes are bully. I have got nine sheep, a two-yearold bull, and two heifers, besides a house and barn. I want to get married. I want to buy bread-andbutter, hoop-skirts, and waterfalls for some person of the female persuasion during life. That's what's the matter with me. But I don't know how to do it."

She is a superstar volunteer at SHS events!




# Join us for a presentation on THE CITY OF EAST SAN DIEGO AND ITS POLICE DEPARTMENT 1912-1923

The little known City of East San Diego, once separate and independent of San Diego, was located in the area now called City Heights. The presentation profiles the short history (1912-1923) of the city and its police department.

Vintage photos of the area, and the officers who served there, will take you back to a simpler time when towns were separated by open land and scrub brush, connected by streetcars, a few 'automobile machines' and bumpy highways.



Gary Mitrovich served in the San Diego Police Department for nearly 33 years. He is the co-founder of the San Diego Police Museum, and was previously Vice-President of the Lakeside Historical Society.
